Definitions

go on | to continue (talking) or move to the next thing

*He didn't understand my first explanation, so I had to **go on** and simplify everything I've said.*

*I am very interested in what you have to say. Please, **go on**.*

carry out | to do or complete something (task, plan, mission..)

*I wish I could **carry out** my plan to visit Europe.*

*I expect my instructions to be **carried out** to the letter.*

pick up | to learn something; to collect; buy

*I still remember some geography that I **picked up** in school.*

*Please **pick up** some groceries on your way home.*

*She **picked up** some real bargains in the sale.*

point out | to select; to tell someone something

*He **pointed out** the best beaches on the map.*

*I'd like to **point out** that we are in this mess because of you.*

come up | to happen unexpectedly

*Something **came up** and I couldn't make it for a meeting in time.*

*We need to prepare for anything that might **come up** and affect our plans.*
